The Outreaching Grads (OG) Program is a group of graduate students from historically underrepresented backgrounds. OGs help to support GSEE, academic departments, and student organizations as they enhance outreach and recruitment efforts for graduate students. The OG Program introduces graduate students to opportunities and resources that help build community and increase racial and ethnic diversity within the framework of the graduate student cycle.

OGs come from an array of diverse backgrounds to assist academic departments and campus partners in their diversity and inclusion recruitment efforts. Graduate students who are committed to increasing representation in graduate education can become OGs.
